OVER THE BADIEL-MOSCARDO'S PART IN THE GUADALAJARA CAMPAIGN OF MARCH 1938

During March 1937 The Italian Corpo de Truppi Voluntarii (CTV) launched a mechanized offensive against the Reupublican 12th Division. But on the other side of the Badiel River a Spanish Nationalist force with WW I style horse foot and guns was on the same errand. Commanded by General Moscardo, the Hero of the Alcazar, they advanced against the left most brigades of the 12th Division.



Cavalry Gruppo Daviega Screens The Advance

This scenario was based on the second or third day of the offensive. Republican reinforcements from the 11th and 14th Divisions were rushed in, so all remnants of the 12th which could be rallied were sent over the Badiel to face Moscardo's command-the Soria Division.

To start the game two reduced Brigata were dug in among ruined villages and farms in the path of the offensive while two more were arriving from over the river. A howatizer battery was dug in while two more field batteries escaped from over the river.
